Their idea: to make a promotional video showcasing the best their town has to offer.

Hoping for a fresh – and, more importantly, cost-effective – solution, the board puts video production duties in the hands of a few local high school students; when they receive hilariously amateurish results, they bring in a professional to finish the job. But teenage friends Aida and Dana have taken the challenge of broadcasting their town's image to heart. Equipped with cell phone cameras and selfie sticks, they set out to capture their community as they see it and to give a voice to the town's underrepresented members.

With wryly observed wit and abundant compassion for her characters, director Gabriela Pichler channels the infectious energy of her cast – a mix of professional and non-professional actors – into a multi-layered portrait of a modernising Sweden.

Amateurs is an excellent take on a unique subject, and Pichler's strength as a director shines through the film; she is indeed one of the most exciting directors currently in Sweden.

Coated with unsightly body hair, her teeth jutting, her face bloated and mottled and her body marked by ancient scars, Tina is a fish out of water in the human world.

Her search for belonging crystallises when Vore (Finnish actor Eero Milonoff) passes through customs. Almost instantly, she can tell something is 'off' about him but for the first time she can't quite put her finger on what it is. Strangely attracted, Tina strikes up a friendship that soon blossoms into romance as she gradually learns uncomfortable truths about who she is. To say more would spoil many of the film's surprising revelations, but the ease with which Abbasi infuses a social dimension with Scandinavian folklore without ever losing his footing in reality is nothing short of breathtaking.

When the affable, weak-willed Rasmus (Anders Juul, Borgen) meets Marie at a party, he's instantly drawn to her and in no time they've progressed from acquaintances to lovers. After all, Marie is a beautiful, intelligent and funny woman. But it's not long until Marie reveals her true nature. Is she maybe not the dream woman he thought she was, but a possessive and manipulative nightmare? That's at least what it looks like from Rasmus's perspective.

But is Marie the horrible one, or is Rasmus's complacency causing his own despair? Brilliantly edited by Nicolaj Monberg, who lets every passive aggressive encroachment hang in the air for the perfectly excruciating amount of time, this Danish box-office hit just might be the best – or worst – date night film this festival.

World-renowned prima ballerina Darling (Danica Curic, Silent Heat Scandi FF 2015) is returning to Copenhagen to dance the lead in the Royal Danish Ballet's production of 'Giselle.' Thanks to her relationship with the company's director (Ulrich Thomsen, The Commune), Darling has secured her husband Frans (Gustaf Skarsgård, Vikings) the plum job of choreographer. But Darling is hiding a hip condition, and after collapsing in agony during rehearsals, her role falls to understudy Polly (Astrid Grarup Elbo, a real dancer at the Royal Ballet), a fragile novice who lacks Darling's high-voltage diva charisma. Unable to let go, Darling decides to train Polly to be the Giselle she can never be, but Darling's devastation at suddenly becoming second fiddle is starting to wreak havoc on the production, and on her marriage.

Working from Kim Fupz Aakeson's (who also writes this year's *Becoming Astrid*) fine script. Stærmose stages both punishing physical exertion and psychological distress with equal panache, keeping us on point right up to the final curtain call.

Rasmus has been given some dire news: He has amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, or A.L.S., and it won't be long before his muscles give out. Fortunately, he's just received an offer from a school acquaintance, Frederik, that'll allow him to live life to the fullest, in his own unique way. The duo (with a loveable 225lb. Saint Bernard in tow) head to Chongging, China to sell Saint Bernard dogs to the country's middle-class. The only catch: The world's fastest-growing marketplace isn't as easy to navigate as the two hapless Danes might have wished.

Danish provocateur Mads Brügger's latest brings all the lessons learned from his subversive, satirical documentaries to this get-rich tale that careens from one disaster to another. Taking full advantage of the comedic skills of its two stars, Danish comic duo Frederik Cilius Jørgensen and Rasmus Bruun. The Saint Bernard Syndicate is a rollicking oddcouple comedy about the pitfalls of striking out into a new economic frontier.

The winner of nine Danish Academy Awards this year including Best Picture - Hlynur Pálmason's feature debut follows the lives of Johan and his younger brother Emil, two miners whose routines, habits, and rituals are ruptured by a violent feud with a neighbouring family.

Shot in an eerie, near-apocalyptic industrial landscape, *Winter Brothers* examines the lives of brothers in a remote region. Younger brother Emil and his older, less excitable sibling Johan are dominated by the company and the constant, deafening hum of the machines they effectively serve. Emil's only consistent outlets, besides pining for the only woman in town, are watching an instructional video on how to properly shoot an antique rifle and the making, consuming, and selling of moonshine. That his latest batch may have made some of his fellow miners seriously ill only exacerbates his outsider status.

Hypnotic, strange and beautiful, *Winter Brothers* lures the audience in with its depiction of a life dictated by routine, only to then erupt with some of the most striking images captured on film this year. Pálmason's fierce aesthetic and fearless approach to the medium makes the film essential viewing.

An impressively original, auspiciously idiosyncratic debut, one that scratches away at truths about masculinity, lovelessness and isolation that are no less true for being all but inexpressible.

Changes threaten the peace in a 1980s suburban Danish household, when the family's patriarch and self-appointed "God" sets out to write his memoirs, in this wryly comedic film adaptation of Jens Blendstrup's 2004 best-selling autobiography.

It's 1986, months after the Chernobyl disaster. With nuclear fall-out weighing heavily on his mind, teenage poet Jens could do with a break from his family. His domineering father Uffe (also known as "God"), an erstwhile writer and now self-styled psychologist, rules the roost in his dressing gown and underwear – hosting seriously weird therapy sessions in the living room. But when God gets bowled a medical bombshell and decides to write his memoirs, a fresh circle of hell breaks loose. As insurrection smoulders on the part of Jens and his two brothers, their mother Gerd Lillian (Swedish singer Lisa Nilsson) does all she can to keep the family together. But for Jens, Thomas and Mikkel to break free of their father's tyrannical rule a showdown with God is inevitable.

Oscar-nominated director Henrik Ruben Genz (*The Killing, Borgen*) perfectly adapts Blendstrup's novel, with Søren Malling a revelation as God.

The young man has found out the family's big secret and seeks for revenge by assaulting people close to Lasse – including Lasse's other, legitimate, son. The hatred between the two brothers leaves the area in a state of violence forcing the villagers to take the law in their own hands. While trying to prevent the brothers from killing each other, the police officer is forced to face his past mistakes.

An arctic modern western taking place on both sides of the northern Finnish-Swedish border, debut director Jussi Hiltunen teams up with the acclaimed cinematographer of *The Fencer* (Scandi FF 2016), *Little Wing* (Scandi FF 2017) and *Hanna* (2011), Tuomo Hutri, for this innovative entry in the emerging genre of far-flung Nordic Noir, which brilliantly makes use of the spectacular landscape's desolation and isolation.

The kind of work I have been waiting for from a Finnish film.

Adapted from the widely praised Icelandic novel The Swan by Guðbergur Bergsson, the story is inspired by a common, but fading Icelandic practice – sending a child to work on a farm, which was considered a test of independence.

In this coming-of-age drama, Sól (astonishingly performed by Gríma Valsdóttir) represents a free-spirited young soul that is exiled from her natural seaside environment at the most critical stage of her youth. Sent to live with distant relatives, she finds herself instead trapped in an immense, wild and uninviting landscape that makes her feel more isolated than ever. Gradually she comprehends that her uncle and aunt's gruff manner isn't ill will. The animals charm her, and she befriends a young Icelandic worker, but when the farmer's daughter returns home from college, Sól comes to realise that the adult world she's so imminently entering is more complicated and callous than she could have ever imagined.

Told from Sól's perspective – and fusing her realisations with haunting dreams and myths – *The Swan* is the sometimes troubling and always affecting tale of a child's growth that also indirectly charts a nation's maturation.

A visually breathtaking piece of cinema.

On July 22, 2011 an armed, right-wing extremist attacked more than 500 youths at a political summer camp on an island outside Oslo.

 $U-July\ 22$ is a fictionalised account of the attack from the perspective of the young victims of Utøya. Erik Poppe, the esteemed director of *The King's Choice* (Scandi FF 2017) channels his outrage into this drama, which has been created in dialogue with survivors. Among the many indignities of the tragedy is the fact that the media were the first to arrive to the scene that day, and since, the perpetrator has been granted much attention in the press.

The film primarily takes place on Utøya, where we meet 19-year-old Kaja who is spending a few days of the holiday there with her young sister Emilie. The two are quarrelling because Emilie is in no mood for the camp and has no desire to go to the barbecue. And so Kaja ends up going alone. Suddenly, the first gunshot is heard. This first shot marks the beginning of a breathless 72-minute-long (the actual duration of the attack) reconstruction of events, filmed in a single take, as seen through the eyes of the victims as the unknown assassin gets closer and closer.

A feature that's never easy to watch but remains heartbreakingly engrossing - and important - from start to finish.

Strange things have been happening in his remote Norwegian village. Livestock is being slaughtered, and while the local farmers suspect a wolf, Aslak's older friend Lasse tells him that the culprit is an ancient monster lurking in the forest. Aslak is a child with too much knowledge but not enough understanding. As his imagination grows, his dog Rapp runs away into the dense forest, sending Aslak on an odyssey to find him.

A mood piece shot in 35mm, Valley of Shadows is instilled with an acute awareness of landscape at its most eerie, powerful, and foreboding. Exquisitely capturing Aslak's bewildered perspective, the film presents details with an unsettling unfamiliarity, as if the adult world were indecipherable and packed with curios whose functions were simply unknowable. Featuring a spectral beauty and innocence, Valley of Shadows is a sophisticated movie dealing with mystery, loss, and acceptance.

An entrancing Norwegian gothic fable told with haunting visuals and striking tonal assurance.

As the film opens in Norway, Nisha (Maria Mozhdah) is balancing two separate lives, slipping out and enjoying the Oslo nightlife with her highschool friends while playing the dutiful daughter at home with her doting but deeply conservative parents and extended family. But when Nisha's budding relationship with a friend is discovered, her father (Adil Hussain, *Life of Pi*), egged on by his influential social circle, takes drastic action to protect his daughter from the "pitfalls" of life in the West. What develops is both gripping and eyeopening, and very much of-the-moment in terms of cultural relevance and the status of women in society.

Other films have dealt with characters pulled between the rules of the old country and the benefits of the new, but few achieve such levels of empathy and resonance. Beautifully directed and performed, What Will People Say will no doubt trigger emotion, conversation and debate with its relevance to the lives of Australian migrants and their families.

The kinetically shot film brims with authenticity and immediacy and benefits from a deeply sympathetic turn from sublime discovery Maria Mozhdah as the lead.

Inspecting the building for the first time, Nojet meets with several tenants and discovers that the apartments on the 7th floor are all under illegal black market contracts. She brings this up with Chris, her nephew and manager of the building. He denies any fraud, but asks Nojet to show some empathy with the poor tenants, who have no other place to go due to the tough housing market. Disillusioned and clueless Nojet seeks help from Lex, the family lawyer, who only sees two options: keep the building as it is, or sell. Either way a fast turnaround is needed.

Nojet isn't a character you would expect to sympathise with, but she's a fascinating female antihero, of a Three Billboards Mildred Hayes type. Not that we know this right away. This scathing absurdist drama from the award-winning Swedish

director of The Yard (Scandi FF 2016), keeps its cards close for an uncomfortable but discussionworthy viewing experience.


